Accessibility

How do I access my sessions on the day?

You will be reminded of the event via email in which you will find an 'access the event' button. You will then be redirected to Whova where you will have to log in with your email and password previously created. Alternatively, you will be able to access the event via the link provided in your confirmation email.

Can I only access the platform on my laptop?

You can access the conference on your laptop/desktop but you can also access the event on your phone by downloading the Whova app. While using the conference platform on your laptop/desktop, please make sure to use Google Chrome or Firefox as recommended by Zoom.

I attended the conference in 2021, can I use the same account on Whova?

Yes, once registered on Eventbrite, you should be able to use the same email address and password as last year to access the conference platform.
